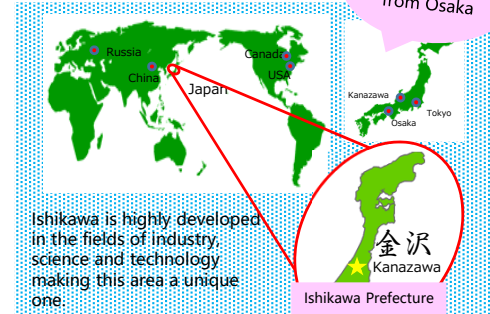

Where is Kanazawa?

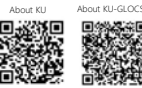


Ishikawa is highly developed in the fields of industry, science and technology, making this area a unique one.

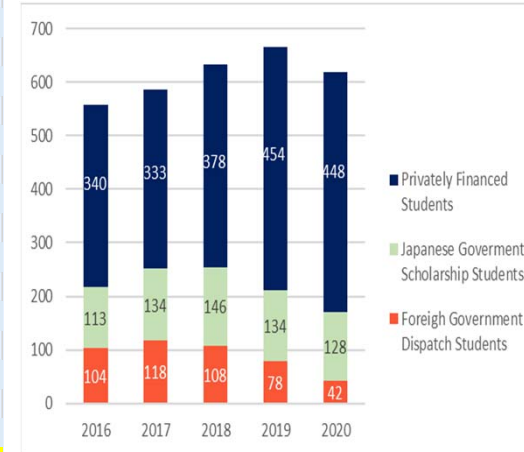

While remaining enrolled at their home institutions, they study in a non-degree program at Kanazawa University for the purpose of taking credited classes or participating in independent research under the guidance of a supervisor.

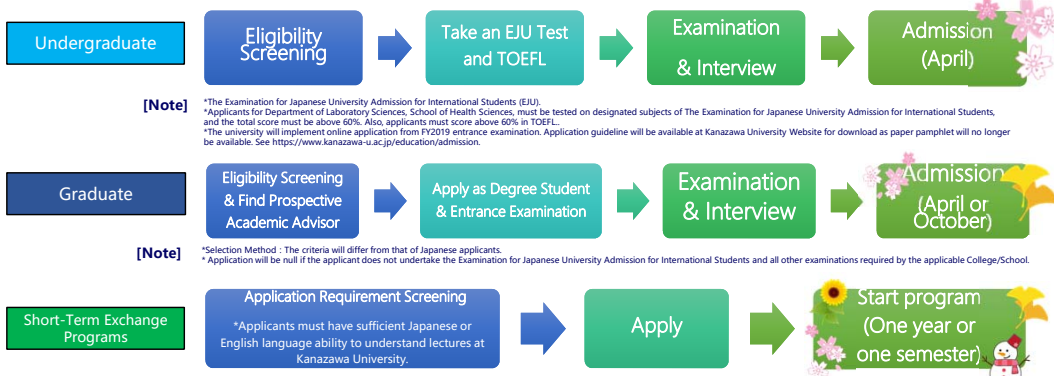
Scholarship

※(Note) You can apply for almost all scholarships except MEXT Scholarship after coming to Japan and becoming a student of Kanazawa University! Kanazawa University will help you apply for scholarship after the enrollment.

Japanese Government (MEXT) Scholarship	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Visit the website of Embassy of Japan in your country for the details or directly ask a staff at the Embassy. Merit basis.
JASSO Honors Scholarship (Gakushu-Shoreihi)	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Japan Student Services Organization (JASSO) offers the scholarship, Gakushu-Shoreihi, to international students with good academic standings.
Scholarship by Private Foundations	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Scholarships available to international students offered by approximately 30 private foundations per year. Note that most of the scholarships require Japanese language proficiency.
Kanazawa University Scholarship	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> The application requirements and monthly allowance vary depending on the foundation. Submit to the Division in charge through a prospective academic adviser at KU. Eligibility: Graduate students at applicants' home university and Degree-seeking graduate students at KU.
